

- Builds on the success of previous initiatives
- Created following a number of preventable serious incidents
- 339,000 estimated hospital admissions related to alcohol
- Consumption in 2015/16 up 22% in past decade

KEY PRINCIPLES

- 1. Prevent and reduce violent crime linked to the licensed economy
- 2. Prevent and reduce sexual offences
- 3. Reduce preventable injury linked to alcohol and drug use in the licensed economy
- 4. Reduce opportunities for criminal activity and anti-social behaviour in licensed premises
- 5. Promote partnerships and engagement with communities and key stakeholders in the licensed economy.
